## I. 2006 PUBLIC OPINION AND CITIZEN SATISFACTION SURVEY

### A. Overview

In 2000, the City of Dublin began performing a Public Opinion and Citizen Satisfaction Research Survey as part of its ongoing efforts to understand and better serve its residents. The goal of the program is to gauge citizen attitudes regarding City services and attributes, customer service, citizen involvement and goals for Dublin.

The information gathered by these surveys provides benchmarks for resident opinion and solid data to measure changing perceptions. The survey and reporting process occurs every two years.

The following is a summary of the 2006 Survey. More detailed survey information can be obtained by contacting Community Relations.

### B. Methodology

The survey was conducted by the City of Dublin Community Relations with the assistance of Clary Communications. This report includes the results from a survey that was mailed to 2,500 randomly selected households, evenly distributed among Dublin's four wards. The households were selected from a database generated using Dublin's Geographic Information System.

The City received 736 responses by the deadline date, February 6, 2006. (In 2004, a comparable 754 surveys were received.) An additional 41 surveys were downloaded from the City of Dublin Website and mailed to the City. Those web responses are not included with the statistical findings of the report, as they are a self-selected group and therefore

not truly random. The nearly 30 percent rate of return is considered extremely high for mail surveys and ensures a +/- 5 percent sampling error at a 95 percent confidence level. The consistently high return over time indicates the data collected is highly reliable and the survey maintains a high degree of validity.

Review of many statistics within the report indicates resident feedback is generally consistent over time giving the survey tool a high degree of validity. The survey of the community also indicates that the data can serve as a reliable benchmark, whether they reflect significant change from previous years or consistency over time.

## D. Analysis and Observations

### Overall Grading By Respondents

When asked to “grade” Dublin as a place to live, 97.5 percent of respondents rated the City as “excellent” or “good.” This is consistent with previous surveys, in which 97.8 percent of respondents rated the City as “excellent” or “good” in 2004, (compared with 96.9 percent in 2002 and 96.7 percent in 2000) (Table A.1).

### City Services/Programs

Most of the City of Dublin’s programs or attributes received strong ratings in the “excellent” or “good” categories (Table A.2).



*Parks and open spaces are highly ranked by Dublin residents.*

## E. Residents’ Goals/Budgetary Priorities for Dublin

### What Would ‘Delight’ Residents?

Respondents were asked to give unaided responses to the following question: “Assuming taxes remain the same, what are some of the things the City could do or provide that would leave you feeling ‘delighted’?”

A significant number of respondents indicated they were already “delighted” (36), and others provided a wide array of suggestions for future improvement. Topics that received multiple mentions from respondents are shown in Table A.3.

### Goals

Respondents were asked, “What should Dublin’s top three goals be?” The top unaided responses are shown in Table A.4.

### Budgetary priorities

In response to an aided question, respondents ranked budget priorities as shown in Table A.5.

## F. Data on Current Areas of Council/Staff Emphasis

### *Analysis and Observations*

Many questions on the survey relate to subjects of particular current interest to City Council and the administration. This summary presents some of the key data. More detailed survey information can be obtained through Community Relations.

### *Growth and Development*

Residents gave “excellent” or “good” ratings to the City for its planning and management of growth as shown in Table A.6.

### *Community Plan Update*

Of survey respondents, 57.4 percent are aware the City has a Community Plan, and the City’s process to update the Community Plan was known by 30.9 percent of respondents.

In the past year, 4.1 percent have been involved in the Community Plan update process.

### *Historic Dublin*

Of those taking the survey, 72.7 percent of respondents rated Historic Dublin as “excellent” or “good”, compared to 69.1 in 2004. “Develop public green space/ park in Historic Dublin” ranked fourth in park priorities, as it did in 2004.

#### ***Perception of available parking:***

Half (50.4 percent) of respondents felt that Historic Dublin offered sufficient parking and an equal number (50.8 percent) agreed that it was easy to locate parking.

***In 2004, respondents were asked yes or no questions about Historic Dublin:***

- 75.5 percent dined in Historic Dublin
- 61.5 percent shopped in the District
- 30.8 percent were satisfied with retail shopping options in Historic Dublin

### *Community Attributes*

Table A.7 indicates respondents’ satisfaction with various dining, shopping and healthcare options in Dublin.

## G. Citizen Involvement, Activities

### *Citizen Involvement*

62.4 percent of survey respondents had a positive image of City government, compared to 59 percent in 2004, 45.3 percent in 2002 and 56.5 percent in 2000.

Other areas of significant change in this category are shown in Table A.8.

## Civic Associations

Of respondents, 68.2 percent are members of a Civic or Homeowners Association.

Over the last year, 26.2 percent participated in a block party sponsored by a Civic or Homeowners Association.

In the past year, 6.6 percent participated in a City parade as a member of a Civic or Homeowners Association.

In the past 12 months, 49.1 percent received information from the City through a Civic or Homeowners Association.

## H. Communications

The survey indicated that overall City communication has improved.

In 2006, 71.7 percent of residents rated the City's communication as either "excellent" or "good", compared to 63.8 percent in 2004.

### Receiving information

Residents reported that their preferred means of getting information from the City is newspapers (25.0 percent), followed by e-mail (20.7 percent), a City newsletter (13.5 percent), the City Website (11.0 percent) and City publications

(8.3 percent). Residents ranked "local government cable" sixth (2.9 percent).

### Website

The number of people using the City Web site to access City information at least once in the previous year rose from 55.2 percent in 2004 to 73.9 percent in 2006. In addition, 70.9 percent said the site was easy to use and understand, compared to 56.2 percent in 2004.

About 10.5 percent of respondents indicated that they purchased Irish Festival tickets online and 18.3 percent used the Web to file City income taxes.
